This body is considered more important these days, it plays an important role as an informative bridge between governing bodies and general public, in absence of media general public cannot know about what kind of bills and acts are passed in the parliament, and what are their positive and negative effects in the society. If media person close their eyes the government officials will do what they want, so media plays a very important and impartial role between government activities and general public, so much so that it is said that the freedom of media is the guarantee of success of republic government.
- Media plays a crucial role in shaping a healthy democracy. It is the backbone of a democracy. Media makes us aware of various social, political and economical activities happening around the world. It is like a mirror, which shows us or strives to show us the bare truth and harsh realities of life.

T.V news channels excessive coverage during elections helps people, especially illiterates, in electing the right person to the power. This reminder compels politicians to be upto their promises in order to remain in power.

Television and radio have made a significant achievement in educating rural illiterate masses in making them aware of all the events in their language. Coverage of exploitative malpractices of village heads and moneylenders has helped in taking stringent actions against them by attracting government's attention.

The media also exposes loopholes in the democratic system, which ultimately helps government in filling the vacuums of loopholes and making a system more accountable, responsive and citizen-friendly. A democracy without media is like a vehicle without wheels.

The perfect blend of technology and human resources (journalist) has not left a single stone unturned in unearthing rampant corruption in politics and society.  is the palladium of all the civil, political, and religious rights"- <u>Junius</u>
- Article 19(1) (a) says that all citizens shall have the right to freedom of speech and expression but the state can put reasonable restrictions on this right on the following grounds:-security of the State, friendly relations with foreign states, public order, decency and morality, contempt of court, demotion, incitement to offence and integrity and sovereignty of India.
- The expression "Freedom of press" has not been used in Article 19 but it is comprehended with in Article 19(1)(a). The expression means freedom from interference from authority which would have the effect of interference with the content and circulation of newspapers. There can not be any interference with that freedom in the name of public interest. The purpose of the press is to advance the public interest by publishing facts and opinions without which a democratic electorate cannot make responsible judgments.
- Freedom of press is the heart of social and political intercourse. It is the primary duty of the courts to uphold the freedom of press and invalidate all laws or administrative actions which interfere with it contrary to the constitutional mandate. Freedom of press has always been a cherished right in all democratic countries. The newspaper not only surveys news but also ideas, opinion and ideologies. It is regarded as the 4th pillar of democracy and is made for the welfare of the country and its people. But this pillar has been infected by the virus of corruption. It is the duty of each and every person related to journalism that how they understand and fulfill their responsibilities and keep themselves away from controversies. - All medias can be tied on the basis of several principles of good journalism loyalty to citizen readers, independence from factions, transparency about sources, fairness in monitoring power, vigilance, detailed and relevant reporting, etc.
- But even assuming that all media organisations follow these principles, would that automatically lead to development? In other words, can media – by purposeful pursuit of these principles - perform a catalytic role in civil society?
- Possibly, but we must not place too much faith in media doing this by itself. There are plenty of obstacles to development within civil society outside of the media. An entire range of institutions in India for instance, the law enforcement system, the judiciary, the health/medical system, the education system, the civil administrative system is in desperate need of pro-development reforms. Our nation in addition has among the most hierarchical and unjust social structures in the world. Even as journalists must continue to report relentlessly, it isn't clear that progress in these areas can be the outcome of a progressive media agenda alone.
- But these are not beyond the ability of media to address, either. There is an important connection between media and the strengthening of civil society: citizenship. Media can play a stronger role if its reporting is premised on citizen participation, and does not regard readers, viewers and listeners as passive consumers of its reporting.

- If the media join hands together it is easy to fight against some of the dangers that loom large upon our society/ country. It will strengthen us in fighting the injustice, prevailing in society and in affecting transformation of society in manner to move ahead for a more democratic, Rights based, just and equitable society.
- Media the 4th pillar of democracy is an important stake holder in protection and promotion of Rights, exposing and fighting injustice, giving directions to social forces and shaping the social aspirations and patterns. Its contribution to the society are uncountable and its role invaluable.
 Today the liberalized and free media has emerged as one of the most powerful tool to fight social political exils/injustice, affect empowerment and facilitate.

The reason for freedom of the press is to ensure that democracy is able to function, so it is important to understand that such legislation does not only protect the functions of the press.



The Rationale

- Treasurer: He / She collects the subscription, always keep the organisation sufficiently funded, writes the accounts, periodically writes the accounts, gets it audited & submits to the organisation for approval

- 6. <u>Director Culture & Fine Arts</u>: Taking your message by culture, Fine Arts, Arts & using humour ("Comedy Remedy" of Humourolgy ExNoRa)


