




Empathy involves understanding another's feelings, thoughts, and wishes and then communicating this understanding back.








Why Is Empathy Necessary'

- 3. Communicate your understanding







Child behavior/statement:

But he hit me first!

Typical response:

Just because he did it does not mean you have to!

Empathic response:

It's not fair. He did the same thing and didn't get caught.





Child behavior/statement:

Typical response:

Those kids hate me. They keep rolling their eyes when I talk.

I'm sure they don't hate you. They are only teasing.

Empathic response:

You know what they meant.





Child behavior/statement:

Typical response:

John keeps telling me he will beat me up if I don't give him my money.

Stand up to him!

Empathic response:

You are scared that if you retaliate, it will make matters worse.





Child behavior/statement:

Typical response:

If I tell them not to gossip, then they will gossip about me.

Real friends don't talk behind each other's backs. Plus, if they do it to her, they will do it to you.

Empathic response:

You want to do the right thing but are afraid they will talk behind your back.

Child behavior/statement:

Typical response:

I invited him to the party even though the other kids think he is weird.

That was so nice. You're such a great kid.

Empathic response:

You did what you thought was right and did not let the other kids influence your decision.

Child behavior/statement:

But all that kid does is whine and complain.

Typical response:

If you do it again, you're sitting out recess.

Empathic response:

It is hard to think about their feelings when they bother you that much.






